
IAWA: Prose, Poetry, Politics and Unsung Heroes Featuring Gil Fagiani, Stephen Siciliano Saturday, May 9 at Cornelia St. Cafe

The Italian American Writers Association (IAWA) presents two activist authors who are also cofounders of the Vito Marcantonio Forum, Gil Fagiani and Stephen Siciliano on Saturday, May 9 at Cornelia St. Café, Greenwich Village. Open Mic followed by features.

Gil Fagiani has published seven collections of poetry. His latest book, Stone Walls (<u>Bordighera Press</u> [2]), focuses on his realtionship with his father growing up in Stamford, Connecticut. This fall Guernica Editions will publish Logos, which chronicles Fagiani's experiences in a South Bronx drug program in the early 1970s. Fagiani was the subject of a New York Times article by David Gonzalez, ,"<u>A Poet Mines Memories of Drug Addiction</u> [3]."

An independent scholar, translator, essayist, short story writer, and poet, his translations have appeared in such anthologies as Poets of the Italian Diaspora, edited by Luigi Bonaffini and Joseph Perricone; and Italoamericana: The Literature of the Great Migration, 1880-1943 (<u>Fordham University Press</u> [4]). He curates the <u>Italian American Writers Association</u> [5]'s reading series, and is an associate editor of Feile-Festa: A Literary Arts Journal.

Los Angeles-based <u>Stephen Siciliano</u> [6] will read from his latest novel-manuscript, The Goodfather, which tells the life story of the marvelous and radical congressman <u>Vito Marcantonio</u> [7] from the perspective of la famiglia Fortunato who lived down the street from him in <u>East Harlem</u> [8]. New York-based pianist and composer Peter Dizozza will play piano.

A journalist, scriptwriter and a script reader for the Creative Artists Agency and United Talent Agency, he is a correspondent for <u>Bloomberg BNA</u> [9], <u>Los Angeles Business Journal</u> [10] and is managing editor at <u>Downtown Los Angeles News</u> [11]. He co-founded and edited the Spanishlanguage weekly, La Otra Orilla (The Other River Bank) in Seville, Spain. His adaptation of Jodi Picoult's novel Change of Heart is set to be filmed later this year. Visit his blog at highwayscribery.blogspot.com
